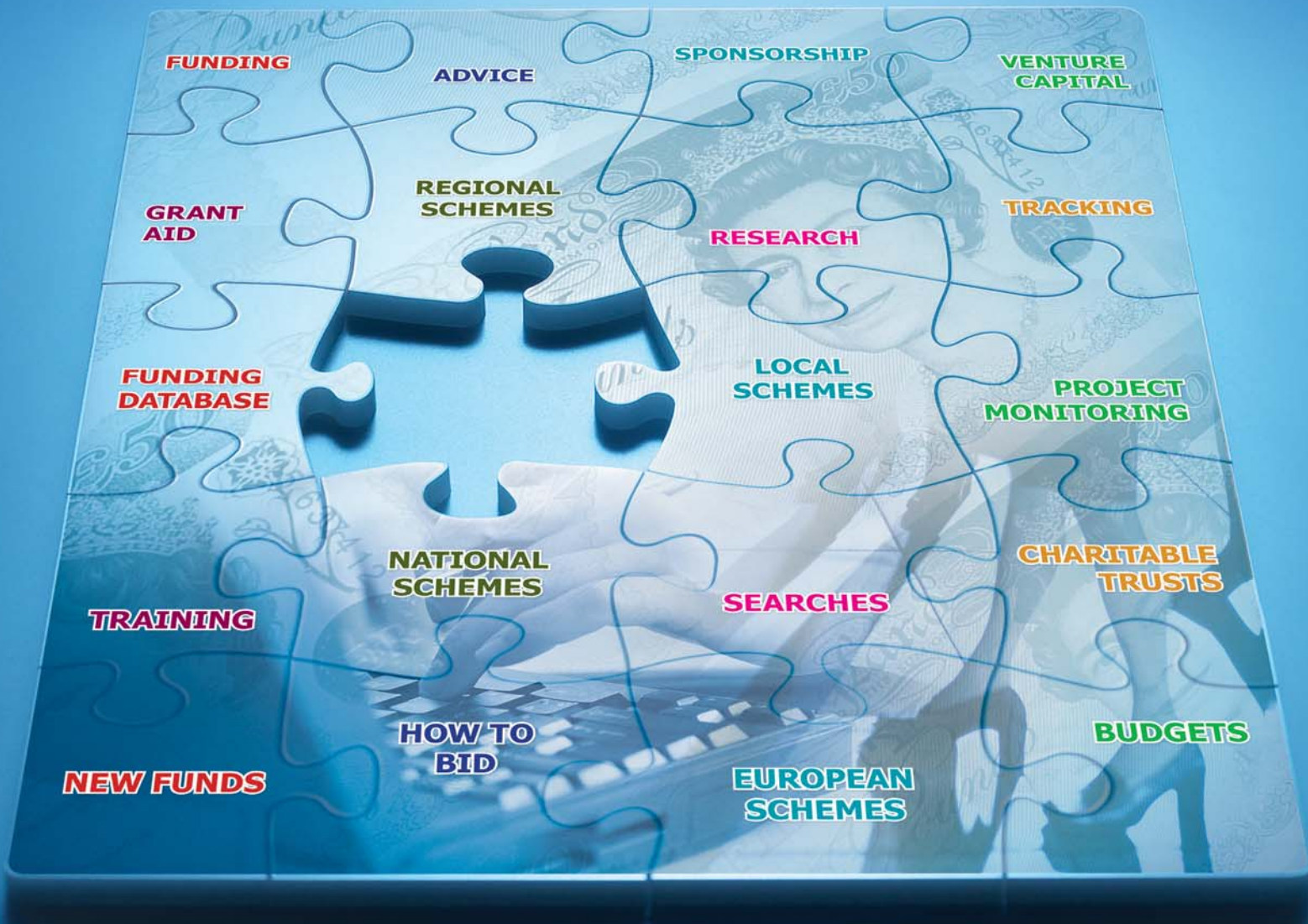
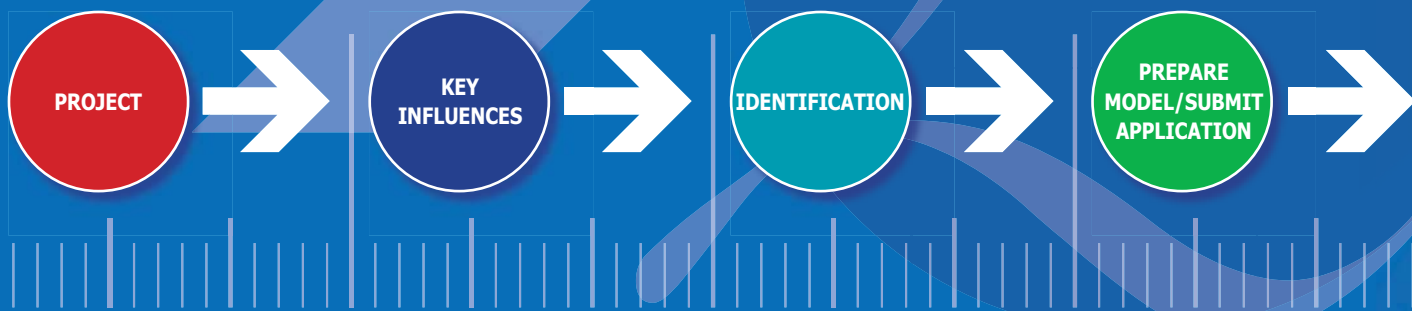

The vision →

From the outset, you need more than a clear vision of your project or initiative. You also need the means to present an equally convincing case for it on paper. What is it that your project actually needs to see it through to fruition? A vision alone is not enough to secure external funding or support. For success, it needs to be presented as a considered, rounded proposition – with its purpose, methods, costs and benefits expressed with clarity.

Unlocking the door →

What type of funding do you require? And, having determined this, where do you go in your quest for funding sources? Do you need prior warning of new schemes that are in the pipeline? Undoubtedly, there is a vast range of opportunities available – many thousands, in fact. But is support most likely to come from local, regional, national or European sources – or a combination of these?

The funding scene is something of a quicksand of ever-changing criteria and opportunities. Where can you gain access to constantly updated information at the tap of a keyboard?

There are a number of key factors that can influence the success of your project – among them timing, location, purpose and benefit. But don't think just in cash terms. Think more in project terms – which is what funders invariably seek.

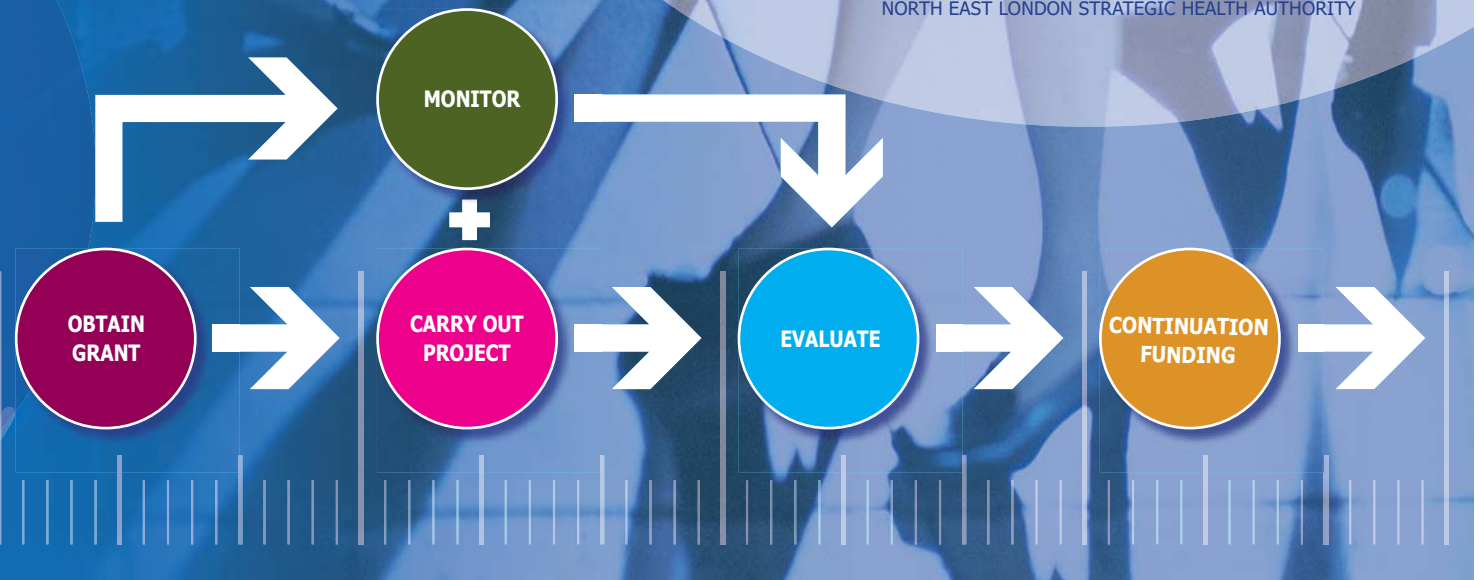
The defining moment →

Vitality, what is the nature of the support you seek? Is it grant aid, a loan, advice, venture capital, sponsorship, awards or some other means of assistance? If matched funding is required, what resources are available to you?

Whatever your project – and however unique it is - the chances are that others have trodden the same or a similar route before you. Is there a conduit available to you that will short-cut your learning curve? In other words, can a third party

organisation act as a facilitator and provide you with valuable feedback on the experience of others?

Modelling your project →

To increase the probability of success, the modelling of your project and the preparation of your bid should be carried out in a way that is appropriate to the needs and expectations of the funder. 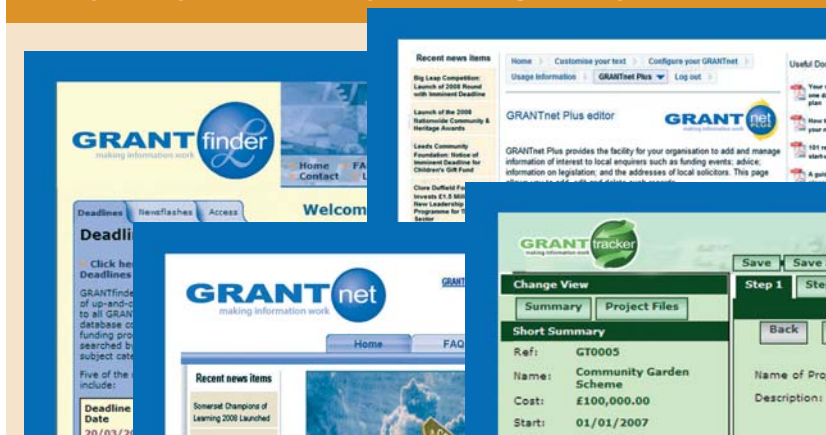

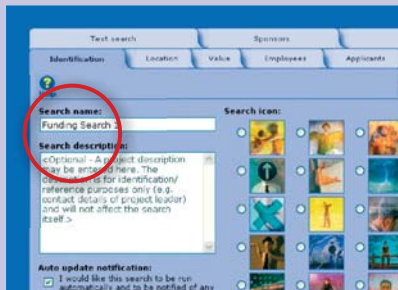

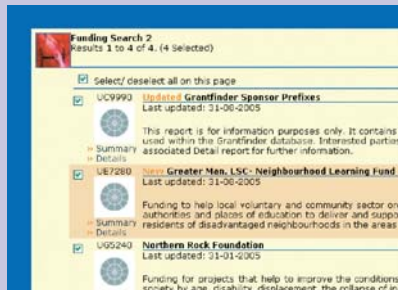

The GRANTfinder search process is user-friendly. Information is presented in jargon-free, plain English.



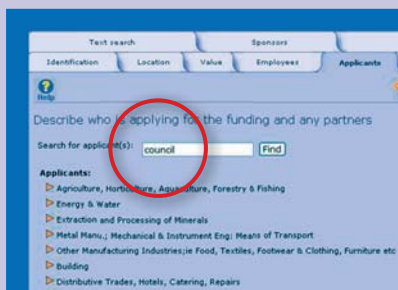

GRANTfinder contains the largest database of its type and has, since 1985, continuously evolved and been developed to reflect our long experience in the business of helping organisations to obtain the support they seek.

Value

Obviously, every project has a value. By informing the system of this figure, GRANTfinder will identify the programmes offering the most appropriate funding levels.

Despite the fact that GRANTfinder contains details of more than 4,000 funding initiatives, it is not

a daunting task for you to navigate the site, run a search and refine the options down to those that relate directly to your project.

Number of employees

This refers to full-time employees. In the case of voluntary organisations and the public sector, this does not apply.

Introducing our Deadlines Database →

Now included on the GRANTfinder website is our Deadlines Database. Providing information on the most important upcoming deadlines, the listing enables you to prioritise applications for the weeks and months ahead. It is searchable by grant title, funding provider, frequency and topic.

You only need to search a handful of criteria. Key in your project details, hit the search button and the system will respond with a range of results that match your needs. The defining criteria are:

Location

Parts of the UK may be more favourable to your project than others. For example, some may be classified as assisted areas or neighbourhood renewal areas – and the nature of funding support could vary accordingly. Definition is made by postcode.

Applicants

By involving other organisations in your bid, the chances of funding success may be increased. Often favoured are partnerships between public, private and voluntary sectors.

To place your project within its appropriate sector, GRANTfinder gives you a combination of sector definitions and drop-down sub sections. This will place your project within a national classification code system, a process that is recognised by the Office of National Statistics and understood by funders. However, there is also a word search facility to help you if you are unsure of the category.

Purpose

Self-evident, but it is worth noting that funding

partners are often looking for results, rather than the project alone. The human factor is key here – such as employment effects, community influences, help for the disaffected, and long-term sustainability. The system also offers filters that direct you to the nature of the assistance – loan, grant, tax refundable scheme, award and so on.

Advanced filtering

In fact, the interactivity of the GRANTfinder site goes one step further and empowers you to run your search against a particular group of funding bodies should you wish to do so.

Results

At this stage, the search process will list funding programmes alphabetically and present them in three levels of detail. Also provided is a message advising you whether the programme in question is open to application at any time or is subject to specific deadlines.

The first of these - a thumbnail summary - enables you to relate your knowledge of the project and make an early elimination of any schemes that are of no interest. The second level has more detail and is downloadable as a Word document, with the potential of being e-mailed to colleagues and partners as an attachment. Finally, the third level delivers a detailed report, again downloadable. This includes information on all the criteria that the funder requires, how the bid will be assessed, and other guidelines and comments to help you prepare a fully rounded submission.

Hyperlinks to e-mail and web addresses are provided at the second and third report levels, offering you a direct line of communication to each funding provider.

But GRANTfinder's search mechanism does not simply relate to identifying funding opportunities for up-and-coming projects. For anyone working in the external funding environment, there is a need to keep a finger on the market pulse at all times.

For example, perhaps you may hear mention in passing of a previously unheard of programme. GRANTfinder's text and sponsor searches allow you to search the database for a particular programme or provider, without a project in mind.

In the same way, the GRANTfinder update bulletin, listing the most recent changes to the database, opens a further window on the latest funding opportunities. Also available as an interactive document, the bulletin can easily be edited before forwarding to community groups and small businesses.

All the extensive GRANTfinder information that is available at your fingertips has the flexibility to be refined, filtered and manipulated in many other ways - to help you get the most from this vast reservoir of data and knowledge. Whatever your level of search, this wealth of information is always interpreted and summarised in a consistent and standardised output format.

Training for success →

GRANTnet – taking GRANTfinder to your clients

Funding opportunities for the community and small businesses






GRANTnet is a user-friendly, on-line search tool through which the community or small businesses can gain access to funding opportunities – direct from your website. It is a refinement developed exclusively for our larger users to offer a high-quality search facility to their own enquirers.

Typically, our users will embrace local authorities, business networking organisations, chambers of commerce, large voluntary organisations, housing associations, dioceses and NHS foundation trusts and federations. To such organisations, a key benefit of GRANTnet is that it empowers and builds the capacity of local groups and businesses.

The great advantage of GRANTnet is that – using a window from your host website – enquirers are able to carry out their own funding searches. They follow a series of simple steps to rapidly access quality information on suitable funding opportunities.

According to how much information you wish them to have, the search results can be provided to one of three pre-defined levels of detail:

-  Standard results – naming the funding scheme and briefly detailing its scope.
-  Enhanced results – a more detailed summary of the scheme, with information on who is eligible to apply and application details and deadline dates.
-  Enhanced results with web addresses – including a link to the funding provider’s website, enabling the user to gain further information without further approval from you.

There are many benefits – quite over and above the fact that the GRANTnet website is powered by GRANTfinder, a long-standing product renowned for the depth and accuracy of its information. In particular, GRANTnet provides you with a

means of identifying the types of project the local community is seeking to carry out – useful to know when the authority is allocating future resource.

The new enhanced GRANTnet is available either as a stand-alone resource or may be integrated into your wider GRANTfinder service. In other words, you can choose whether or not to use GRANTfinder to facilitate the project moving forward. In any event, you can access details of your clients’ projects and, to satisfy e-government requirements, extract statistics in Excel format.

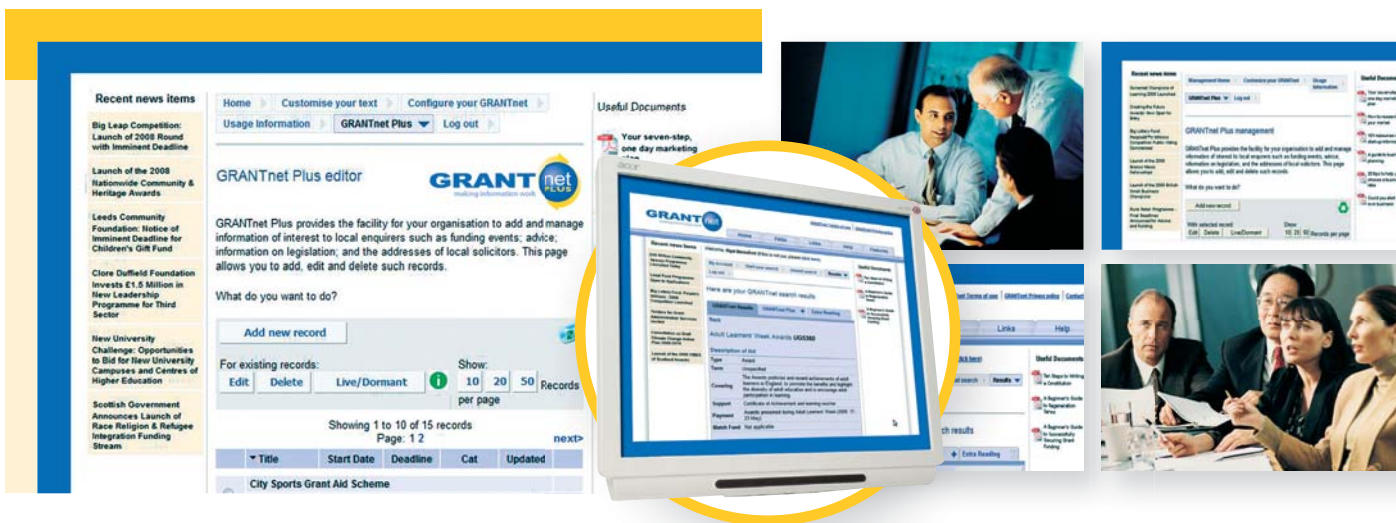

For example, it gives you the means of presenting information about a local funding fair or communicating a diary of local business networking opportunities.

GRANTnet Plus creates an easily updateable management record that can be tailored to match the specific needs of individual fundraiser activity. Typically, this would include details of all historic, current and projected initiatives. It might embrace a summary of pertinent legislation and details of local funding providers. And it would certainly provide the level of information you wish to include on all funding officer contacts.

The important benefit is that – although GRANTnet Plus provides all the basic structure and prompts that organisations need – it is simplicity itself for users to add and remove data. This can be done without involving webmasters or IT

managers. Password access and basic skill in word processing are all that is required to change information – and it is also possible to cut and paste from other documents, including images and tables.

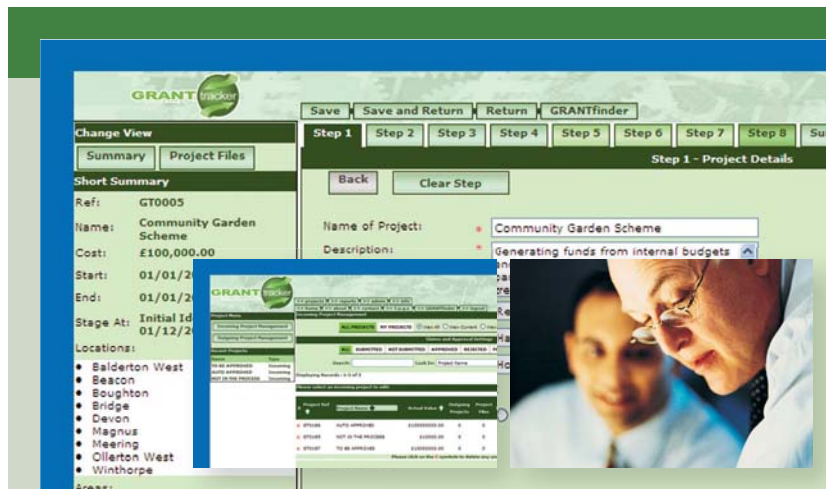
